Ale

A type of beer brewed from malted barley using top-fermenting brewer's yeast.

American & English Pale Ale

Of British origin, expect a good balance of malt and hops. American versions tend to be cleaner and hoppier, while British tend to be more malty, buttery, aromatic and balanced.

Brown Ale

Spawned from the English Brown Ale, the American version can simply use American ingredients. Many other versions may have additions of coffee or nuts. This style also includes "Dark Ales".

Pilsner

A Pale Lager that was developed in the 19th century in the city of Pilsen, Bohemia and has a light straw to golden color and crystal clear.

India Pale Ale

An ale that is light amber to copper in color, medium to medium-high in alcohol by volume, hoppy, citrus, bitter and sometimes malty flavor. First brewed in the 18th century in England.

Lagers are typically stored for at least three weeks before being served. It is the more popular of two main types of beer.

Saison

Modern saisons are generally highly carbonated, fruity and spicy-sometimes from the addition of spices.

Belgian

Comprises the most diverse national collection of quality beer in the world. Styles vary from the popular Pale Lager to Lambics and Flemish Reds. Belgian beer-brewing's origins go back to the Middle Ages.

Belgian Style

Beers that are brewed outside of Belgium, using the same techniques and using Belgian yeasts.

Wheat

Usually top-fermented and using a significant proportion of wheat. Wheat beers also contain a significant proportion of malted barley. Flavor varies considerably, depending on specific style and are often hazy.

Stout

A dark beer made using roasted malts or roast barley. There are a number of variations. Traditionally called porters for most of the 1700's, though the word stout was used as early as 1677.

Porter

The name was first used in the 18th century from its popularity with the street and river porters in England. Porters are generally brewed with dark malts and have notes of chocolate and coffee.

Fruit/Herb Beer

Brewed using fruit or fruit flavoring, herbs, and/or vegetables.
